BOARD DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY

The Education Act allows for the Board to delegate certain of its responsibilities and powers to others.

The Board authorizes the Superintendent to do any act or thing or exercise any power that the Board may do, or is required to do or exercise, except those matters which, in accordance with section 52(1) of the Education Act, cannot be delegated.

Notwithstanding the above, the Board also reserves to itself the authority to make decisions on specific matters requiring Board approval in accordance with Board policies and practices.

Specifically:

- 1. The Superintendent is delegated the authority to develop Administrative Procedures that are consistent with provincial policies and procedures for the following areas:
 - a) Inclusive Education
 - b) Guidance and Counseling
 - c) Services for Students and Children
 - d) Student discipline
 - e) School-Based Decision Making
 - f) Student Evaluation
 - g) Staff Growth, Supervision and Evaluation
 - h) Home Education
 - i) Early Childhood Services
 - i) Outreach Programs
 - k) Locally Developed/Acquired and Authorized Junior and Senior High School **Complementary Courses**
 - I) Knowledge and Employability
 - m) Off Campus Education
 - n) English Language Learners
 - o) Second Languages
 - p) School Fees and Costs
- 2. The Superintendent is authorized to suspend a teacher from the performance of the teacher's duties or to terminate the services of a teacher. The suspension or termination shall be conducted in accordance with the requirements of the Education Act According to the Education Act, section 43, this decision cannot be appealed to the board of trustees.
