"Day on the Creek" - May 24, 2017

You are invited.....

Following a series of "Community Conversation on Learning" workshops sponsored by the Livingstone Range School Division in 2014 and 2015, a core group of teachers, parents, community organizations, and interested individuals have been working together to facilitate the development of outdoor education and stewardship experiences for students from schools within the towns of Pincher Creek, Lundbreck, and Brocket. Loosely organized under the banner of POEM, the Pincher Outdoor Education Movement, this group is putting together a "Day on the Creek" event on May 24, 2017.

Teachers, students, and the public will be invited to attend a series of stations set up along and adjacent to Pincher Creek within the boundaries of the Town of Pincher Creek. It is hoped that this "Day on the Creek" will kick-start efforts to get students outside and actively engaged in environmental learning and stewardship.

Nora Manners (Waterton Biosphere Reserve Association) and Sarah Downey (Alberta Parks) are spearheading development of the program for the "Day on the Creek" event. We would like to work with teachers to identify curriculum connections and experiences they would like to share with their students. Some examples of stations that could be set up along the creek include:

- aquatic invertebrate investigation/monitoring
- riparian health assessment
- invasive species identification and control
- water quality monitoring/sampling
- riparian habitats and special local wildlife (i.e. beavers, garter snakes, birds, bears)
- water treatment (Town of Pincher Creek)
- local archaeology, history and stories about how Pincher Creek has been used for 1000s of years.

The day will be planned so that there are cross-curricular connections throughout all subjects.

While the final structure of the day will depend on the response received from teachers, the initial concept is to have one-half of the day (either morning or afternoon) be more free-flowing with several stations set up and allowing participants to circulate amongst the stations (targeted more at elementary school and public). The other portion of the day would be more structured with blocks of time reserved for individual classes to attend specific presentations (targeted more at junior/high school).

February 24, 2017 is the deadline for teachers to sign-up to attend the "Day on the Creek" event. Signup consists of emailing the following information to Nora Manners at nmanners@watertonbiosphere.com

- name and contact information (phone and email)
- grade level or class if applicable (i.e. Grade 3 or Science 20)
- curricular outcomes they would like to cover
- what time block(s) will work best for their class (morning, afternoon, or specific time window)

February 25 to March 18, 2017

Organizers will evaluate requests, identify presenters/stations needed, determine how/if we can meet all requests, discuss with teachers, and develop a schedule for the day. Once the schedule is finalized, a registration form will be completed with each teacher confirming the details of their attendance (number of students, grade/course, curriculum connections, and time slot for participation/presentation if any).

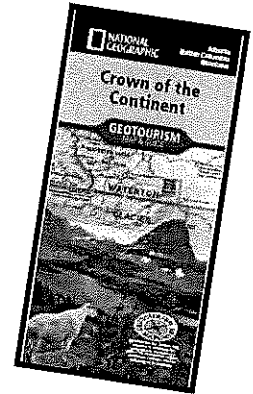
Regional Economic Development Alliance (REDA) Update
