Dual Credit Program

Earn high school *and* post-secondary credit! Partnerships with Southern Alberta post-secondary institutions provide students opportunities and choice in career pathways.

Flight Academy

Willow Creek Composite High School students earn high school credit as they develop the knowledge and skills to prepare them for a private pilot's license after graduation. This is a full-year program.

Off-Campus Program

Earn high school credits through meaningful community volunteer experience.

Green Certificate Program

The Green Certificate Program lets high school students earn credits in courses relating to agricultural specializations.

Hockey Skills Programs

Skills programs at Matthew Halton High School (offered Nov-Apr) and J.T. Foster High School (offered Sept-Jan) allow students in Grades 7-9 to develop their hockey skills and knowledge on and off the ice.

Livingstone Ski Academy

This featured full-year (Sept-June) program at Livingstone School is a skills-based program encompassing freestyle and downhill training. Located in the Rocky Mountains of Alberta at beautiful Castle Mountain Resort, LSA offers a full-spectrum package to both competitive athletes and students enrolled in the international and recreational programs who want to experience all that the region has to offer.



RESOURCES AND SUPPORT

We offer 24-hour student support led by a team of professionals including teachers, advisors, homestay coordinators, and host families. Our Academic Support team helps students with University preparation and ongoing academic assistance to help prepare students for the future.

SCHOOL SCHEDULES

Our 2-semester terms run from September to January and from February to June. A typical day at school is 8:45am-11:45am for classes, a lunch break from 11:45am to 12:20pm, and classes from 12:20pm to 3:30pm.

TRANSPORTATION

Many students in Livingstone Range School Division ride the school bus to and from school each day. These students typically live farther from the school or in rural settings and the school bus is included in the fees for International Students. Those who live closer to the school walk or Homestay families may choose to drive the students to school.
