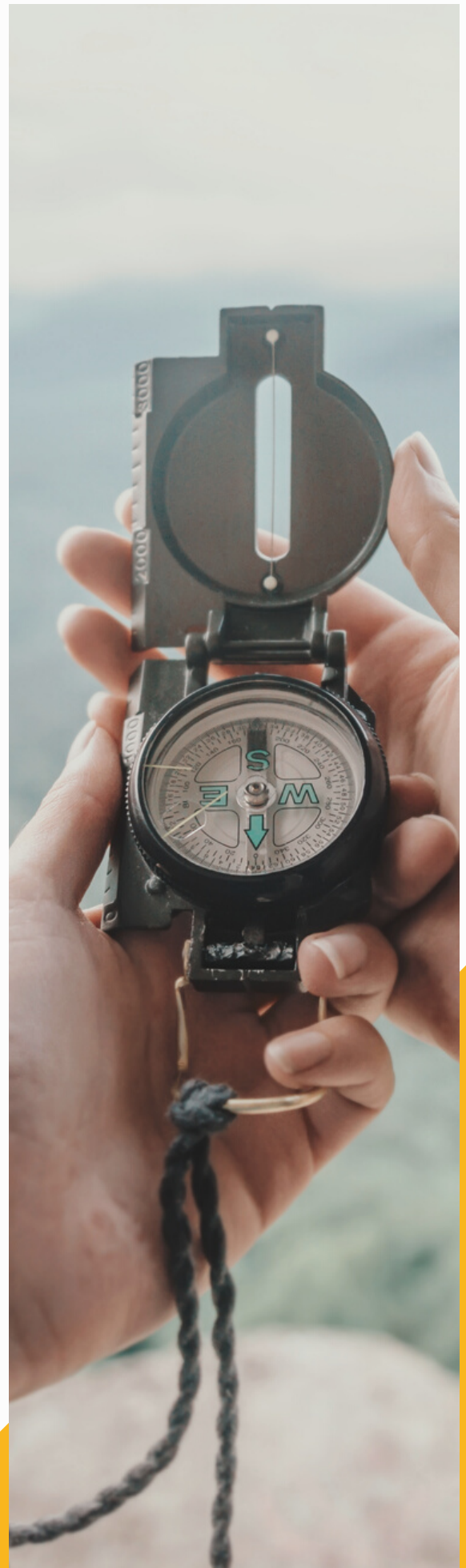

NAVIGATION COURSE BUNDLE

1) Map Reading

Learn the different parts of a topographic map and what they mean. What are the symbols, colours, and how does this information work? Topographic maps contain a lot of information, and can be a helpful tool to explore the outdoors.
