- 1) **Livingstone Leaders Presentation** – Teacher Advisor Alysa Fisher with their executive members Jasmine (JTF), Nadine (CCHS), Cordelia (FPW), Mackinley (LIV), Abigail (MHHS), and Cassidy (WCCHS, unable to attend) gave a very informative and insightful presentation. Each school executive gave the Board of Trustees information as to what their individual schools are doing to inspire students and provide student voice in their school. This information included 1) Who we are: leaders who strive to make a difference in our schools and in our communities! 2) Purpose and Vision 3) Goal: as youth leaders, is to be a voice for students and create an impact by recognizing what needs to change for the better of our education, connections, and futures. The Board of Trustees would like to congratulate each school for their innovative and fun ways they have found to develop student leadership skills, inspire, and embrace student voice within LRSD schools. Each executive and school should be very proud of the leadership and participation within this program, you truly are leaders who strive to be a voice for students and create an impact.
- 2) **Early Learning Presentation** - Leanne Feller, Early Learning/Inclusive Learning Coach, provided the Board with an update of the work being accomplished throughout the division. Currently there are 2 Licensed Preschools and 1 Early Learning Centre within our division with the capacity to have 65 students enrolled. Pre-kindergarten children will continue to have access to Program Unit Funding (PUF). Currently the Livingstone Range School Division has 47 PUF students accessing educational support and the projection for the 2023-2024 school year is similar. The Livingstone Range School Division will continue to have developmental check-ins and encourage more families to register in Early Learning. The first six years of a child's life is an amazing time in human development, when the brain is developing connections faster than at any other time in a person's life.
