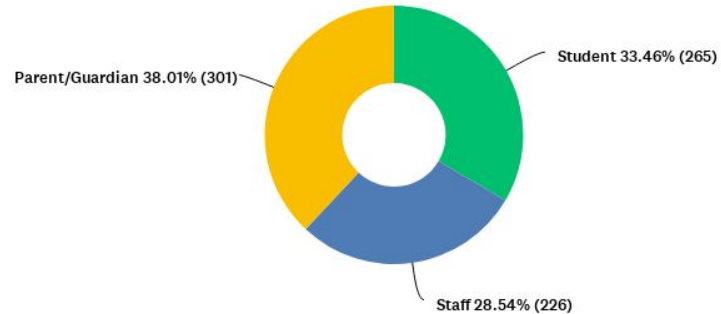
The survey sought feedback on the Engagement area goal that

How have you seen setting and achieving goals contributing to student success in Livingstone Range School Division?

Top 5 Themes:

1. Effectiveness of Goal Setting
2. Awareness and Communication
3. Individualized Approach
4. Student Autonomy and Involvement
5. Support and Resources

1. EFFECTIVENESS OF GOAL SETTING

Positive sentiment with respondents noticing improvements in academic performance due to goal setting.

- "Setting goals made me a better student." (Student)
- "My daughter, who had classes she needed to improve on, she set her own goals to them, and this year she is 10-15% higher marks in those classes." (Parent/Guardian)

2. AWARENESS AND COMMUNICATION



Mixed sentiment with some parents being unaware of goal-setting practices, indicating a need for better communication.

- "I'm not aware of any goal setting going on at their school."
(Parent/Guardian)
- "I'm sure our school does this, I am just not aware of it." (Parent/Guardian)

3. INDIVIDUALIZED APPROACH

Positive sentiment where customized goal setting is appreciated, showing that individualized goals are impactful.

- "In my son's grade 3 class they have explored several ways to create accountability when creating a goal." (Parent/Guardian)
- "School-wide reading goals and numeracy goals tailored to individual students' levels." (Staff)

4. STUDENT AUTONOMY AND INVOLVEMENT



Positive sentiment reflecting the success of programs that involve student choice and self-directed goal setting.

- "I make plans for myself and my success when it comes to assignments, overall school journey, and my future." (Student)
- "Students setting meaningful goals have increased student engagement and aspirations." (Staff)

5. SUPPORT AND RESOURCES



Mixed sentiment highlighting the need for more resources or guidance to help students set and achieve their goals.

- “Setting goals with students helps me to know where to start when planning how to best support them.” (Staff)
- “Teachers help with you accomplishing any goals you may have.” (Student)
